Pool Guidelines and updates

Hot summer days are here, and the pool is a great place to stay cool. Here's some guidelines to make enjoying the pool pleasant for all of us.

1. Pool safety Equipment. The lifesaving equipment located on the fence at the deep end of the pool is for emergency use ONLY. Use of the equipment for anything other than its intended purpose will result in the offender being barred from the pool the rest of the season.
2. Pool water temperature. The pool heater's combustion chamber has incurred a catastrophic failure. Considering the age of the heater (10+ years old) and cost of repair it makes sense to replace the heater instead of repairing it. The new heater is to be installed June 12.
3. Housekeeping at pool. The pool area is as clean as Residents keep it. Be a mensch and clean up any spilled food, wrappers, containers etc before you leave. Straighten the chairs you used and take ALL your belongings with you.
4. Children. It is enjoyable to observe children having fun at the pool...to a degree. If you do bring children to the pool, be the responsible adult and enforce the following. ABSOLUTELY NO RUNNING. Curtail screaming and excessive splashing. Remember other Residents go to the pool to enjoy relaxation.
5. Dogs. No dogs are allowed within the fenced pool area. Not even if they are carried. Don't be the dog owner that portrays dog owners in a negative light.
6. Pool Key. Replacement pool keys are \$35. Contact Jim at 952-933-9747 if you need a key.
